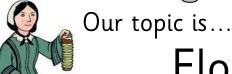

Y1 Phonics

Y1 pupils will be particularly busy this half term practising their phonics skills, in preparation for the National Phonics Screening in June. This involves the pupils being able to recognise all the different sounds taught so far and read a variety of real and nonsense words using these skills. It will only take about 10 minutes per child and is completed in a relaxed and comfortable way. Some Y2 pupils will also re-take the Phonics Screening to evidence progress throughout this year. Please continue to read regularly at home with your child. Information and past screening checks are freely available at www.gov.uk/education/phonics and there are plenty of websites offering information, advice and activities to complete at home. Y1 teachers are also happy to help and discuss any questions you may have.

Each half term we give your child an individual writing and numeracy target. We would very much appreciate it if you could continue to work with your child on this target at home. What's going on in Year Two?



Florence Nightingale

In our Florence Nightingale topic we will learn about horrible diseases and the terrible state of hospitals during the Crimean War. Through our exciting visitor, we will learn about Florence's life and how she managed to make changes to these dirty, appalling conditions. Combining our science work about healthy food and our literacy work on instructions, we will prepare a delicious vegetable soup, just like Florence did for the soldiers in the war! We will also imagine what it was like to be a wounded soldier or a nurse during this time and will write postcards from the soldiers to their families.

Literacy:

We have many exciting writing opportunities coming up over this half term! We will be writing instructions to make Florence Nightingale's 'Feel Good Soup'! Following this, we will be writing exciting stories about soldiers during the Crimean war and finish with a non-fiction text about Florence Nightingale. These will require us to write different sentence types (commands, statements, questions, exclamations), use conjunctions and write adverbs using the 'ly' suffix. We will begin to focus on joined handwriting and more accurate spelling in all pieces of work.

Maths:

In maths we will be continuing to develop our understanding of different measures and scales. We will be comparing mass, length, capacity and temperature using the >, < and = signs. We will also look at money, including different ways to make the same amount, finding totals and giving change. Going to the shop, counting up coins from a pocket or purse or simply playing with money is a great way to familiarise children with the value of each coin. We will continue to practise telling the time so please keep up this essential skill at home. We will also be practising our mental arithmetic, encouraging the children to work out simple answers quickly in their head.

<u>Science</u>: This half term we will continue to learn about animals and humans. We will consider the basic needs of humans and animals, thinking about the soldiers at war. This will be followed by learning about different types of food and whether they are healthy or not. We will sort the food into different categories and work on creating balanced meals and menus.
