LITERACY

In Literacy this half term, the Year three children are going to be concentrating on authors and letters. The author that the children will be investigating is Anthony Browne. The children will be looking at the similarities and differences between his stories, such as story settings, and will also discuss any running themes that the children may spot after reading several of his stories.

The children will be researching the life of Anthony Browne and his influences, and then going on to write a book review based on their favourite story.

The children will then look at the conventions of letter writing and discuss the differences between formal and informal letters. Once the children

are confident with writing a letter, they are going to be writing a letter to Anthony Browne and hopefully the children will then get a response from him.

YORKSHIRE

The Year three children will be learning about our White Rose county of Yorkshire this half term. The Geography elements of this topic will involve locating Yorkshire on a map and identifying towns and cities in Yorkshire. The children will then go on to consider the key features of the Yorkshire Dales, and the children's knowledge of this will be hugely enhanced by their overnight stay in Malham, North Yorkshire. The children can expect to see beautiful countryside, interesting lime stone scenery, such as Malham Cove; a curved lime stone cliff and many more features of the Yorkshire Dales. MATHEMATICS

As you are now aware, the children will be working on groups of objectives linked to the following strands of maths throughout the rest of this year:

- Number and Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division
- Fractions and Decimals
- Measurement
- Geometry (Shape and Space)
- Statistics (Data Handlinq)



This half term, pupils in Year 3 will work on Fractions and Time. In class we will be working hard to compare fractions and tell the time to the nearest minute.

You could help out at home by asking your children to:

- Cut food up into thirds, quarters and fifths.
- Look out for analogue and digital clocks in the home.
- Ask your child to tell you what time it as at different points in the day or evening!

SCIENCE



This half term Year 3 will be studying rocks and soils.

The children will learn that rocks are used for a variety of purposes. They will be testing different rocks for their properties and observing and comparing different characteristics of rocks. Children will then go on to think about why these characteristics result in different rocks being chosen for different purposes.
