Welcome back after the Easter holiday!

<u>Literacy</u>

Mathematics

This half term, children will begin a topic based on imaginary worlds. The topic is always very popular where children will have the opportunity to read lots of stories with an imaginary world setting and imagine that they have visited settings such as space, magical forests and under the sea! The main story will be Alice in Wonderland - this is a wonderful story that will provide lots of stimuli for a variety of writing tasks - children will be writing a diary entry as the character of Alice, writing a letter, and planning and writing instructions for The Mad Hatter's tea party. The children will also be asked to write a story where they find themselves in their own imaginary world. These writing tasks will really develop the children's descriptive writing during this topic; they will be asked to describe in detail what they can see, hear and smell, as well as thinking about their feelings using descriptive vocabulary such as similes and metaphors. If you have any stories at home with an imaginary world setting, it would be great if your child could bring them in for us to all have a read! Children will be continuing to use IPEELL (Introduction, Point, Explanation, Ending, Links and Language) which will help them to structure their nonfiction writing tasks and ensure that they include all of the key points asked of them.

Remember, you can help your child with their learning by discussing what they have studied during the day's lesson. Encourage them to read every night, listening to them whenever possible. It would be good if you could read stories at home with different story settings or imaginary worlds, which the children could then describe to you in detail and predict what may happen in this setting.

Ancient Egypt

This half term, History, Geography, Art and DT are going to be taught through the topic of The Ancient Egyptians. The children will be learning about who the Ancient Egyptians were, the importance of The River Nile, hieroglyphics, mummification and much more! The children will be locating Egypt on a map, investigating facts about the everyday life of the Ancient Egyptians, as well as facts about the Ancient Egyptian Pharos. We will be finding about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, and considering what we can learn about Ancient Egypt from just one artefact.



As you are now aware, the children will be working on groups of objectives linked to the following strands of Maths throughout the Summer Term:

- Number and Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division
- Fractions and Decimals
- Measurement
- Geometry (Shape and Space)
- Statistics (Data Handling)

This half term, pupils will be working on the topic of Measurement. Children will be looking at a range of measures and converting between different units of measures. They will be asked to make sensible estimates of the measurements of everyday objects, and then asked to measure these objects accurately. Children will also be challenged to solve a range of problems linked to this topic. We will be encouraging pupils to collaborate with each other, value each other's opinions and to persevere with trickier problems! Children will also continue to practise their times tables - please continue to support your child at home with their times tables knowledge - we are seeing a huge improvement in class!


<u>Science</u>

This half term the Year Four children will be studying the topic of Habitats. They will be learning about how to identify organisms using a key, and will then go on to create their own keys. Children will also be carrying out research as to why species are endangered.
