#### **COVID CLARITY**

Thank you for all your support on all things Covid! As you know, it is essential we all follow guidance in and out of school. We will always- with this newsletter- provide detailed advice on everything linked to Covid-19 but key points we must follow are:

- Children must not attend school if showing a main symptom of high temperature, new cough, loss of smell/taste. A PCR test should be arranged- school can help with this if you are unsure.
- If any household member shows symptoms then the entire household must isolate until a negative test is returned- or for 10 days if no test or a positive test!
- If a child has been in contact with a positive case they must isolate for 10 days regardless of a subsequent negative test for the child.
- If a member of the household has been in contact with a positive case, that person must isolate for 10 days regardless of a subsequent negative test for that person- children can still attend unless a household member subsequently shows symptoms.

**Lateral Flow Testing** 

The Government have rolled out a National Lateral Flow Testing Programme for all families with a pupil attending Primary/Secondary School or College.

Lateral Flow Tests for COVID are a simple test that can be done at home with the results in 30 minutes.

All staff at school are doing the tests twice a week and if we can get parents doing this as well, it will be brilliant! It will hopefully spot any outbreaks very quickly and help to keep our whole school community safe.

You can go to www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests for more information or to order a test kit. Or simply pop to Asda between 1pm and 8pm and pick a test kit up.

## COVID-19 related absence from school or childcare: a guide for parents and carers

### The main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with COVID-19 have at least 1 of these symptoms.

If your child has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19

- Keep your child at home.
- Arrange a test online (search NHS COVID-19 testing) or by calling 119 as soon as possible.
- Anyone your child lives with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home. When you get your test result you will be advised what to do

If you or your child are worried about COVID-19, speak to your health visitor or school nurse

LFT should not be used to rule out COVID-19 in someone who has symptoms or who has been in contact with a positive case	the PCR test comes back negative or 10 days have passed since the person started with symptoms
