


Calderdale's Public Health department has updated their guidance to schools given the rapidly rising cases of Covid – and subsequent hospital admissions – in our area. Rates in children are dramatically rising across the country since schools returned in September.

The letter they have sent can be found in the Covid Update section of our school website – www.ashgreen.info. The recommendations are ones that we already follow in the main – particularly not mixing groups unnecessarily, reducing fact to face events such as traditional Parents' Evenings, ventilation in classrooms, wearing masks in busy communal areas etc. The ONE NEW recommendation from Public Health is that if there is a positive case confirmed by PCR in a household then children in that household do not attend school until a PCR test has been taken and returned negative and that it is recommended that tests for children are taken3-5 days after the confirmation of the positive PCR test. However, this is not legal guidance and if families want children to attend school despite there being a positive PCR case in the household, then they can. As a minimum, if there is a positive PCR case in the household then other household do NOT attend school until a PCR test and as stated above, the recommendation is now that other children in that household do NOT attend school until a PCR negative test result is returned.

Children have taken a letter home. Thank you for your support – we are trying to make almost impossible decisions to balance home/school relations, children's academic progress and the health and safety of our community.





COVID 19 SYMPTOMS, TESTS, FOLLOW UP!

Remember that if anyone in your family is showing symptoms of Covid 19:

- A high temperature for any period of time
- A new and continuous cough
- A loss of smell or taste

That person will need a Covid 19 PCR test. For this, follow: https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/

If a child or staff member shows these symptoms they should NOT come into school/will be sent home from school. A test should be arranged. When the test is negative they can return.

IF a test is positive that person would need to isolate for 10 days and we would contact the families of anyone we felt may have been a contact.

There is no longer a requirement for children under 18 or double jabbed adults to isolate as contacts. However, the recommendation is that those contacts- including household members of the positive case- take a PCR test, they do not have to isolate unless that test proved positive. At Ash Green, if we hear of a positive case then we WILL inform the families of children who may have been contacts and recommend as a minimum that they take a PCR test but those children CAN still come to school (See Page 1 for Calderdale recommendations) If the child subsequently showed symptoms then they would have to isolate for 10 days or take a PCR test which if negative would mean they could return.

It remains such a difficult time for us all. Covid cases are still worryingly high and we must put continued measures in place to support distancing, increased hygiene and prevent widespread contact between groups. The safety and welfare of our children, families and staff members is paramount.
